Subject: Amendments to Various Rules Related to Renewal and Continuing Education Requirements for Licensure or Certification

The Louisiana Board of Veterinary Medicine has proposed amendments to LAC 46:LXXXV. Sections 305, 407, 811, 1213, and 1215 in Chapters 3, 4, 8, and 12 – respectively – in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, R.S. 49:950 et seq.

To facilitate the Department of Justice's review of the proposed rule, Louisiana Board of Veterinary Medicine provides answers to the following questions.

1. Describe any relevant factual background to the occupational regulation and the purpose of the occupational regulation? [Explain]

There are no substantive changes to the renewal or continuing education requirements for licensure or certification. The proposed rule changes clarify guidelines regarding continuing education and late fees for veterinarians who fail to renew their license. The proposed rule change expressly states that a veterinarian who fails to renew their license is subject to a \$150 fine, this is the current practice and is being codified.
